1. Go to conference planning site at:

2. Click on the "Presenter" link or go directly to the Presenters page at:

3. Click on the link in the phrase "Click to EDIT an existing Presenter". You are presented with a "search" page, where you must specify a search of the Presenter database. Enter your last name AND your Presenter ID number (see below), then click on the "Start Search" button. The results will be a list from which you click on your Presenter ID number and are then presented with a page of data for a specific presentation at this conference. V. Fan Tait is a pediatric neurologist, Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Utah Health Sciences Center, and Bureau Director of Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN) for the Utah Department of Health. For 15 years she served as a Pediatric Neurologist and medical director of neurorehabilitation at Primary Children's Medical Center and the University of Utah Medical Center. For the last five years, she has served as Bureau Director for CSHCN and, as such, is responsible for nine statewide programs. These programs include three direct clinical programs; population screening programs, such as newborn blood screening, newborn hearing screening, and birth defects registry and surveillance; case management programs for target populations of children who are technology-dependent or in foster care; and Early Intervention.

She has been principal investigator or co-principal investigator on three system-change grants: the Utah Medical Home Collaborative Project, the Utah Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities Grant, and the Utah Traumatic Brain Injury Planning Grant. Other grants currently funded through the CSHCN Bureau include: the Genetics Implementation Grant; three Early Hearing Detection and Intervention grants; the Autism Surveillance Grant; and the Utah Center for Birth Defects Research and Prevention. In addition, Utah was one of eleven states recently selected to participate in the National Initiative for Children's Healthcare Quality (NICHQ) Medical Home Learning Collaborative.

Dr. Tait serves on numerous state advisory boards and committees. She has been active in the Utah Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), having served as vice president, president and legislative chair. Currently, she is a member of the national AAP Committee on State Government Affairs and is also serving as chair of the AAP Taskforce on Newborn Hearing.

Short Session Description:

Presentation will address outcomes from a study evaluating the prevalence of stimulant medication for the treatment of ADHD among Utah children ages 0 - 18. Nationally, concern has been expressed about the over-diagnosis of ADHD, pointing to the several-fold increase in prescriptions for stimulant medication among children.
