

Be a Part of Utah's First Super Tuesday! March 3, 2020

For the first time, Utah will participate in the Presidential Primary voting process on Tuesday, March 3. More than one third of the US population votes on Super Tuesday.

Questions you might be asking yourself:

1. I moved since the last election...
 - If you stayed in the same county, notify the [County Clerk's](#) office of your new address. The Postal Service does not forward ballots.
 - If you changed counties or state, you need to [register to vote!](#)
2. Am I eligible to vote in the Presidential Primary Election?
 - Political parties set the rules on who can vote in their primary elections:
 - **Democratic Party:** all voters, regardless of affiliation, may vote in its Presidential Primary Election
 - **Republican Party:** only voters affiliated with the Republican Party may vote in its Presidential Primary Election
3. Is my voter registration up-to-date?
 - It's easy to check - www.vote.utah.gov
4. Do I need to vote in the Presidential Primary Election?
 - Well, there are 16 candidates on the Democratic Party slate and 7 on the Republican Party ticket. Do you have an opinion?
5. I'm not affiliated with either the Democratic or the Republican Party. Will I get a ballot?
If you are not affiliated with either the Democratic or the Republican Party and want to vote, here are your options:
 - If you want to vote in the Democratic Presidential Primary Election, contact your county clerk to request a ballot. If you prefer to vote in person, simply visit an early voting location or Election Day voting location and request a Democratic ballot from the poll worker.
 - If you want to vote in the Republican Presidential Primary Election, you must affiliate with the Republican Party. Continue reading this page for more information.
